THE CLASSIC CITY BAND

The Classic City Band was organized in July 1976, to provide those citizens of the Athens/Clarke County Area with experience in playing musical instruments an opportunity to utilize their talents in a community-based musical group.

Nine years later, the organization lists among its members, persons of all walks of life including public school teachers, college professors, lawyers, businessmen, students, and retired individuals.

Since its organization, the Band has performed for countless people at a large number of community events. Annually, the Band presents free concerts for those in the area who thrill to the sound of a Concert Band. During the last concert season, these concerts were highlighted by the appearance as guest conductor, of Merle Evans, conductor of the Ringling Brothers Barnum & Bailey Circus Band for over fifty years, who led the Band in a program featuring music from the Big Top. The Band subsequently presented the same concert, again under the baton of Mr. Evans at the Civic Center in Atlanta.

Members of the Band receive nothing for their services, other than the pleasure of performing with the group. The Band is supported entirely by donations from various civic-minded citizens and organizations who want to assist in this form of musical entertainment.
