## The Classic City Band

The Classic City Band, Georgia's oldest community band, was organized in 1975 by Robert Peckham, Larry McLure, Jewel John, Charles Douglas, Clyde Noble, and Olin Parker. This elite wind ensemble was founded as a non-profit organization in May 1976 for the purpose of preserving the cultural heritage and musical traditions of the American concert band. The Band's repertoire includes marches, overtures, "pop" selections, galops, waltzes, polkas, operatic excerpts, humoresques, circus music, jazz, ragtime, and instrumental solos and ensembles. This Band has provided a year round musical outlet for its members who gather Tuesday evenings to make music. For over twenty-five years, the Classic City Band has presented an average of five free admission concerts each year for the citizens of Northeast Georgia. As well as Athens, the band has performed in Madison, Gainesville, Hartwell, and other small communities. Membership in Classic City Band is open to qualified musicians age 14 or over, and auditions are not required. The band is not a parade or marching organization. All members of the band perform voluntarily without pay. Expenses of the Band are dependent upon donations.\*

In 1977, selected members of the band created the "Heritage Band" inviting wind musicians from all over the North American continent to join in recording extant band music, music that was still in manuscript, and pieces that had never been recorded before. Six recordings followed called the "Heritage of the March Series", all funded by the Hoe Foundation. These recordings were distributed to music libraries of colleges and universities throughout the United States providing a historical record of important lost band music. In 1984, members of the Band paid tribute to Robert Hoe of Poughkeepsie, New York (the founder and sponsor of the Foundation) by producing the recording, "Memories of the Big Top", a compendum of the best of circus music. This recording was conducted by the legendary Merle Evans, who led the Ringling Brothers Barnum Bailey Band for over 50 years.

Americans have loved bands for over 200 years. No other form of music appeals so deeply and surely to the emotions of such a cross section of people, yet at the same time cuts so sharply and delightfully across the lines of birth, education, income, and occupation. The music of a fine concert band is a magical voice, speaking a universal language that requires no translation. In the first twenty five years of its existance, the Classic City Band has become regarded as a major community and regional resource for the preservation and exhibition of great band literature of all nations from the 18th Century to the Present.
