Welcome, ladies and gentlemen to the annual winter concert of the Classic City Band. Many of you are long time friends of the band and are aware of what the band is, who the members are and the history of the group. Newcomers may not know these things and for their benefit, a brief history of the band follows.

The Classic City Band which is 17 years of age is dedicated to the preservation of the music and culture of the American Concert Band. It was founded by a group of adult musicians, who in their younger years had participated in musical programs of high schools and colleges, were still interested in music as an avocation and who were seeking a venue where this would be possible. The Classic City Band was established and for 17 years has provided a place for those interested in maintaining proficiency on musical instrumentat.

We meet weekly from mid-September through mid-July at the Clarke Central High School Band Room. Our current membership approximates 50 members and includes retirees, lawyers, college professors, judges, housewives, business women, salesmen and college students. The ages of our group run from the teens to those over 70 years of age.

Each year we play concerts in Athens and the surrounding areas. During our existence we have played concerts from Atlanta on the west, to Hartwell on the east, and from Gainesville on the north to Madison on the south.

We are completely a not for profit group. No one receives anything for performing in the band other than the personal enjoyment derived from playing in an ensemble such as this. What money we receive for our performances and from donations is used for the maintenance of our library and the purchase of necessary band supplies.
